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Characteristics: Light yellow-green hue. Scents of meadow herbs, stone fruit and quince on the nose. On the palate are a touch of biscuit, fine acidity with salty notes and a beautiful, lengthy finish. A gorgeous, powerful Chardonnay reflecting pure Pannonian character.

Origin: This vintage is the first to come exclusively from the Leithagebirge – from which the wine takes its name. There, the Chardonnay grapes – picked by hand – grew on vines up to 25 years old. These are planted in eastern- and southern-exposed vineyards in Winden and Breitenbrunn, where the soils are comprised heavily of chalk and slate.

Vinification: Picked by hand end of September 2011 with 20° KMW; de-stemmed, short maceration period - without sulfur; carefully pressed, then processed according to the gravity principle without pumps; gross sedimentation at 15° C; spontaneous fermentation; matured for 13 months in 500-liter and 2000-liter wooden barrels; 100% malolactic; bottled with glass closures in mid-November 2012.
