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Origin: The red is sourced from both sides of Lake Neusiedl in Burgenland. On the west side of the lake, the vines are found on the limestone and slate slopes of the Leithagebirge. On the east side of the lake, grapes come from the gravelly Parndorf Plateau and the humus-rich Heideboden. This wine is minimalistic and reduced to the essential. This means appetizing drinkability of a high standard with fine cherry fruit, earthy spice, well-integrated tannins, and moderate alcohol content.

Our view: If our red were human, with its nearly fifteen years it would be at the worst stage of adolescence – defiant and rebellious. Despite the fact that we gave it all the freedom, it developed actually really well. Red now presents itself quite grown-up and has remained uncomplicated, inspired, and good-natured.

In short: An excellent accompaniment for everywhere and everyday. Since 2012, it is officially a “Qualitätswein” available in the popular bottle formats 0.375, 0.75, 1.5, and 3.0 litres (each a good choice).

By the way: As one can see, the red now has a new design. Why? Simply because its qualitative development motivated us to adapt its appearance to communicate its quality and unique and natural character at first glance. We are pleased that the native Gols artist Nikolaus Eberstaller has redesigned the label.
